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## 1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

#### 1.1 INTRODUCTION

Nalbari Commerce College, Nalbari, is a premier co-educational institution of higher education primarily imparting education in commerce. Experiencing the vacuum and realizing the urgent need for such an institution, a good number of personalities from different walks of life comprising educationists and intellectuals, social workers, thinkers, and businessmen had made a drive to establish Nalbari Commerce College in the late eighties of the past century. The pioneering zeal and endeavour of those learned persons gave birth to the college on 18 August 1979. It is located in the southern part of the district headquarters and at a distance of about 72 kilometres from the state capital.

Started as a single-faculty commerce college affiliated to Gauhati University, the college came under the deficit Grants-in-Aid system in 1992 and then in 2005 the college was provincialized by the Govt. of Assam as per provisions of the Assam College Employees (Provincialization) Act, 2005. The college was assessed and accredited (1st Cycle) by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in 2004 with 'C+' Grade. But in 2016, the college was reaccredited at 'A' Grade (CGPA 3.10) by NAAC in its assessment and accreditation of the college for the 2nd Cycle.

Initially, the college started a Pre-University Course in Commerce stream under Gauhati University and then in 1984, it started Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) Program. Then from the Academic Session 2015-2016, the college started Master of Commerce (M.Com.) Program. Further, in 2017, Bachelor of Vocational Education in Information Technology under Gauhati University in regular mode was introduced from the Academic Session 2017-2018. The college started Bachelor of Arts (BA) and Bachelor of B.Voc. IT in Retail Management from 2017-2018 and 2019-2020 respectively.

The college was recognized as an Academic Partner of the National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NEILIT) and a Training partner of the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) and the college has been offering various job-oriented skill development courses since the Academic Session 2022-2023. The college has been offering various PG and UG programs parallelly in distance mode.

#### Vision

The vision of the college is to motivate and strengthen new entrants to the institution to acquire practical education for being self-employed making them job-givers rather than job-seekers and injecting work culture to confront the challenges that have been emerging.

- 1. To provide a quality environment for teaching-learning and research to fulfil students' needs and expectations.
- 2. To empower students of the college with knowledge and skills for employability, entrepreneurship, and

- 4. To improve existing academic, administrative, infrastructural, and technological resources for effective realisation of the mission of the college.

- 2. To induce knowledge and skills for employability, entrepreneurship, and self-employment of students.
- 3. To provide skill education for making students self-reliant.
- 4. To develop skills such as conceptual skills, technical skills and practical skills in the fields of industry, commerce, management and accounting.
- 5. To prepare a student for a business career or to start a business enterprise of his/her own by familiarizing them with the behaviour of markets, products as well as finance.
- 6. To develop the ability in each student to identify business opportunities, analyze their risk-return possibilities and support business development.
- 7. To cultivate in students a business attitude and skills considering its ethical side.
- 8. To provide basic knowledge of technological tools including computers and their application in business.
- 9. To develop skills in the use of information technology for business and other activities.
- 10. To encourage the spirit of work culture among students for national growth.

## 1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

#### **Institutional Strength**

- 1. The college offers a PG Course in Commerce.
- 2. The college offers a Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) in Information Technology under Gauhati University which provide skill education.
- 3. The college offers Job-oriented computer courses under NIELIT and PMKVY 4.0 scheme.
- 4. The teachers are highly research oriented.
- 5. In-house research projects by students under teachers' guidance are carried out.
- 6. There is a well equipped Computer Laboratory with 60 numbers of computers.
- 7. The college has a central library, with a well-stock of textbooks, references and sufficient numbers of journals, magazines, newspapers etc.
- 8. The college has a Women's Hostel where 33 boarders can be accommodated.
- 9. The college has one Sports Complex constructed with the UGC grants measuring 2555 sq. ft. which provides necessary indoor and outdoor sports items like Table Tennis, Carom and Badminton.
- 10. 35 CCTV cameras have been installed at different locations of the college mainly to ensure security.
- 11. Scholarships from the Government are availed by the students of SC, ST and OBC communities. Economically weaker students are also given benefits like fee waivers, free books etc.
- 12. The college has a unit of National Cadet Corps (NCC) under 50 Assam Air Sqn NCC Unit, Guwahati having 50 vacancies. Cadets are enrolled on UG programs.
- 13. There is a National Service Scheme (NSS) Cell in the college. Volunteers are engaged in different social activities.
- 14. WiFi Internet facility is available for teachers as well as students.

- 15. Add-on vocational courses in computer application, insurance, taxation, share and stock training and entrepreneurship are offered.
- 16. The college offers some awards and the awards are sponsored by faculty members of the college. The awards are Best Graduate Award (Sponsored by Dr N. Kalita), Best Reader Award (Sponsored by Librarian), Student of the Year Award (Sponsored by M K Kalita), Best Entrepreneur Award (Sponsored by BB Das), Best Social Worker Award (Sponsored by Dr Devajit Mahanta, Most Inspiring Woman Award sponsored by Dr Rajat Bhattacharjee)

#### **Institutional Weakness**

- 1. The college has been suffering from a shortage of land. It has only 1.3 acres of land where there is no further chance of extension of the existing area.
- 2. The college has been suffering from a shortage of permanent teaching posts. There are only 14 permanent teaching posts whereas departments like Assamese, English, Mathematics & Statistics, and Information Technology have only 01 posts respectively. The department of Finance which offers major to maximum students at the UG level has only 02 permanent posts.
- 3. In the colleges of Assam, there is no provision for appointing Physical Instructors and music and Dance Teachers, which has imposed a hindrance in developing these extra-curricular qualities among the students.
- 4. The college has not been able to provide sufficient funds for departmental research projects.
- 5. The college has not been able to provide placement services to the pass-out students.
- 6. The college does not have a Gymnasium for the students.
- 7. Due to a shortage of land, the college does not have a playground.
- 8. Though the college has a Women's Hostel, it does not have a Boys' Hostel.

#### **Institutional Opportunity**

- 1. The college can submit a proposal to Govt. of Assam for infrastructural development to divide the large classes into sections for effective teaching-learning.
- 2. The college can place a proposal to the Govt. of Assam for sanctioning more permanent teaching and non-teaching posts.
- 3. The college can acquire land in neighbouring areas for playgrounds and Boys' Hostel.
- 4. The college can organize more National level seminars or workshops in the coming future.
- 5. The teachers can undertake Minor/Major Research Projects as almost all the faculty members have completed at least one Minor Research Project.
- 6. The college campus has Wi-Fi internet connectivity. So, the college can make provision for online teaching-learning with due linkage with external organizations.
- 7. The college can open some more job-oriented courses for the students in order to enhance job opportunities after completion of graduation.
- 8. The college can organize more extension activities for the students and community on issues like climate change, pollution, inclusion, health awareness, women's rights, child labour, human rights etc.

#### **Institutional Challenge**

1. The college will have to challenge the scarcity of permanent teaching and non-teaching posts until the

Govt. of Assam sanctions additional posts.

- 2. The college will have to challenge the scarcity of funds to purchase land.
- 3. The college will have to challenge the problem of creating linkage with industries/companies/govt. Organizations to provide placement services to the graduates.
- 4. The college will have to challenge the students' economic crisis after offering job-oriented courses in self-financing mode as many of the students belong to economically backward families.
- 5. The college will have to challenge the land crisis to provide hostel facilities to the male students.
- 6. The college will have to challenge the funding crisis to establish a gymnasium, swimming pool etc. as well as to provide adequate sports facilities to the students due to lack of necessary land and infrastructure facilities.

#### 1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

#### **Curricular Aspects**

The college offers a diverse range of academic programs catering to the needs of its students and the demands of the evolving job market. It offers a Postgraduate (PG) Course in Commerce, providing advanced knowledge in the field. The college emphasizes vocational education by offering a Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) in Information Technology under Gauhati University, which aims to equip students with industry-relevant skills for better employment opportunities.

In collaboration with various national initiatives, the college offers Job-Oriented NECB 2.0 Courses under the National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT), Guwahati. Additionally, it provides job-oriented courses under the 'Skill Hub Initiative' as part of the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY 4.0), which focuses on skill development and enhances employability.

The college also offers specialized major courses in Accountancy, Management, and Finance under the B.Com program and Assamese and Sociology under the B.A. program. To further enhance the employability of students, the institution provides short-term add-on courses in areas like Insurance, Taxation, Share and Stock Trading, and Entrepreneurship, alongside computer courses that complement both undergraduate and postgraduate programs.

Recognizing the importance of communication skills in the modern workforce, the Department of English offers a certificate course in Communicative Skill Development to help students improve their communication abilities.

For those interested in distance learning, the college offers a variety of programs in UG, PG, and PG Diploma courses through distance education. These programs are available in collaboration with Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU), Gauhati University Centre of Distance and Online Education (GUCODE), and the Institute of Distance and Open Learning (IDOL), Gauhati University, making education more accessible for working professionals and students unable to attend regular classes.

Through these varied programs, the college aims to foster skill development, enhance employability, and provide quality education to a diverse student body.

#### **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

The college has established a comprehensive and transparent approach to teaching, learning, and evaluation to ensure the academic growth and success of its students. The Admission Committee plays a crucial role in ensuring transparency in the admission process, making the necessary information available through the college website, prospectus, and notifications in leading newspapers.

To support students from diverse backgrounds, the college offers bridge courses for those coming from other streams, such as Arts and Science, to help them acclimate to their new academic environment. Subject-wise remedial coaching is provided to students who fail in examinations, ensuring that they get the necessary academic support to improve their performance. The college also arranges tutorial classes after regular class hours, offering more personalized attention to students.

In terms of teaching methodologies, faculty members prepare teaching plans and maintain teachers' diaries, which are monitored by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) to track academic progress. While the traditional lecture method remains central, faculty members enhance the learning experience by incorporating seminars, group discussions, and audio-visual aids, along with utilizing the internet to enrich the learning process. Additionally, teachers leverage WhatsApp groups to facilitate communication and ensure that students can access learning materials and updates conveniently.

The college also encourages faculty development through participation in Orientation Courses (OCs), Refresher Courses (RCs), Short-Term Courses (STCs), Seminars, Workshops, and Training Programs, which helps teachers stay current with the latest developments in their fields.

The college adheres strictly to the evaluation system set by the affiliating university, conducting sessional examinations, seminars, and group discussions as part of the assessment process. In addition to academic performance, the evaluation also considers the holistic behaviour of students, ensuring a well-rounded approach to assessing their progress and development. Through these practices, the college ensures a robust academic environment that fosters continuous learning and development.

#### Research, Innovations and Extension

The college places significant emphasis on research, consultancy, and extension activities, fostering an environment that promotes academic inquiry and community welfare. Faculty members are encouraged to engage in research, and the college proudly boasts of 5 faculty members who have been awarded M.Phil. degrees, while 7 have earned Ph.D. degrees from various universities. Additionally, 4 faculty members are currently pursuing Ph.D. degrees. The college has completed 10 Minor Research Projects (MRPs), with one more ongoing project. Faculty members also receive support in their research endeavours, with the college providing an annual research grant of Rs. 40,000 for one faculty member to carry out an MRP. In 2023, Dr Uddipana Gogoi, Assistant Professor in the Department of Finance, completed her Minor Research Project, and Dr Rajat Bhattacharjee, also from the Department of Finance, has been sanctioned a research grant for 2024.

In addition to faculty-driven research, the college encourages in-house research projects by students under the guidance of their teachers. Departments organize seminars, group discussions, and workshops to cultivate a research culture among students. The college has organized numerous state and national-level seminars, with 1 state-level seminar and 11 national-level seminars sponsored by NAAC, ICSSR, and UGC.

Faculty members actively participate in external workshops, seminars, and conferences, presenting research papers that enhance their academic competencies. Many research papers authored by faculty members have

been published in national and international journals and seminar proceedings.

The college is also committed to extension activities for the benefit of both students and the broader community. These activities include programs on environmental awareness, adult education, blood donation, and health awareness, organized by various college committees, units, and cells. The college participates in the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan by adopting five villages (Karia, Janigog, Mugkuchi, Terechia, and Digheli) and conducting development activities.

Furthermore, the college supports faculty involvement in book writing, with over 50 books published by national publishers. The Career Guidance Cell provides career counselling programs and maintains a register for regular updates on career counselling services offered to students and the public. Through these initiatives, the college supports both academic excellence and community development.

#### **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

The college is well-equipped with modern infrastructure and learning resources that facilitate both academic and extracurricular activities. The campus features 19 classrooms, with 6 of them equipped with projectors to support interactive learning. The college also boasts a Conference Hall with a seating capacity of 120, which is equipped with projectors, laptops, a green board, and other audio-visual tools. For meetings and videoconferencing, there is a Conference Room fitted with digital equipment for recording teaching materials and conducting virtual sessions.

In terms of computer facilities, the college has a Computer Laboratory with 62 computers, and a central library that provides access to a wide range of textbooks, reference materials, journals, magazines, and newspapers. The library also has a Digital Section with 12 Wi-Fi-enabled computers, allowing students to access digital materials and N-List Programs via INFLIBNET. Additionally, the central library has Internet and reprographic facilities and a Book Bank for students. Each department maintains its departmental library for convenience.

The college provides a Digital Printer cum Photocopier for the use of teaching and office staff. A separate building (1240 sq. ft.) houses the Study Centres for Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University and Assam State Open School. The college also publishes an annual students' magazine, contributing to the overall student development.

The Women's Hostel can accommodate 33 boarders, while the canteen offers separate seating for teachers and students. The college has a Sports Complex measuring 2555 sq. ft. with indoor sports items such as table tennis, carom, and badminton, alongside a Volleyball Court and Basketball Court on the campus. The college provides necessary facilities for public speaking events, including meetings, seminars, and workshops.

For student health, the college operates a Health Centre attended by part-time doctors, and free health check-up programs and health awareness initiatives are organized regularly. Security is ensured through a 7-foot brick wall around the 1.3-acre campus, 35 CCTV cameras, and a night chowkidar. The security measures extend to the Women's Hostel, which is located within the campus. The Hostel Warden's residence further enhances the safety of the hostel boarders.

#### **Student Support and Progression**

The college provides comprehensive support to its students, fostering both academic and personal growth. At the beginning of each academic session, the college publishes an updated prospectus containing essential academic and administrative information to guide students. Financial support is available through scholarships for SC, ST, and OBC students, and economically disadvantaged students benefit from fee waivers and free books.

The college encourages student involvement in co-curricular activities, with a National Cadet Corps (NCC) unit and National Service Scheme (NSS) providing opportunities for social service and leadership development. The college also supports students' participation in events by offering facilities and financial assistance.

To ensure the well-being of students, the college has a Health Centre and provides first-aid services, while organizing health camps for regular checkups. In emergencies, students are referred to nearby hospitals.

The English Department organizes a Communicative Skill Development Course to improve students' communication abilities. For slow learners, the college provides remedial classes and extra support. The college also publishes a student magazine to showcase the talents of students, faculty, and staff.

The college emphasizes career guidance through its Career Guidance Cell and Extension Activity Cell, which organize counselling sessions with experts to help students make informed career choices. The Grievance Redressal Cell and committees for the prevention of sexual harassment and anti-ragging ensure a safe and supportive environment for students.

Wi-Fi is available across the campus, and students have access to add-on vocational courses in areas like computer applications, insurance, and entrepreneurship. Annual sports and cultural events are organized to discover and nurture student talents.

The college also offers various awards sponsored by faculty members to recognize outstanding students in different fields. Additionally, remedial classes and personalized academic support are provided for students at risk of failure.

In terms of progression, the college started M.Com. in 2015-16, and approximately 55% of graduates pursue further studies, while others venture into entrepreneurship or secure jobs in the public or private sectors. The college also provides opportunities for students to pursue higher education through its distance-learning mode.

#### Governance, Leadership and Management

The governance, leadership, and management of the college are effectively structured, ensuring the smooth functioning of academic and administrative activities. The Governing Body serves as the highest authority in managing internal matters and policy formulation for the development of the institution. It is responsible for approving policies and decisions, including financial matters, and empowering the principal to implement these policies. The principal, with inputs from stakeholders, ensures that the action plans are carried out effectively and monitors their progress for continual improvement.

The Governing Body plays a crucial role in overseeing financial management, approving budgeted amounts, and monitoring the efficient use of resources. For matters related to salary expenditure, an annual budget is prepared and audited by the government auditors. The college also has an internal audit system to track all other expenditures, supported by various committees like the Construction Committee, Purchase Committee, and

#### Library Purchase Committee.

Leadership within the college is decentralized, with Heads of Departments (HoDs) managing the distribution of syllabi and coordinating departmental activities, such as seminars and workshops. The faculty members actively participate in various academic and administrative committees, providing valuable support to the Principal and contributing to the institution's growth. Teachers are encouraged to engage in research activities and attend seminars, workshops, and other professional development programs to enhance their academic competence.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) plays an essential role in suggesting policies for the college's academic development, implementing these policies, and working with various committees to ensure their success. The college has a performance appraisal system for teachers, implemented by the IQAC, which includes self-assessments and evaluations by the administration. The information gathered through performance appraisals is used to assign teachers with responsibilities for both personal and institutional development.

The college follows a comprehensive audit mechanism, both internal and external (government), to ensure financial transparency and accountability. All expenditures are made under the approved annual budget and are regularly audited to maintain proper financial management.

#### **Institutional preparedness for NEP**

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:

Nalbari Commerce College, Nalbari is an affiliated college under Gauhati University, Guwahati. The college strictly follows courses and curricula prescribed by the affiliating university. However, considering the immense significance of multidisciplinary study in higher education, the college has adopted some measures to acquaint students with diverse aspects of knowledge. Nalbari Commerce College plans to offer a multidisciplinary flexible curriculum that enables multiple entries and exits at the end of the first, second and third years of undergraduate education. It allows students to modify their course of study to their interests and goals by offering a range of core and elective courses. The

curriculum designed by Gauhati University includes a set of required core courses that all students must complete as well as a range of elective courses that students can choose from based on their interests. This allows students to customize their course of study to some extent, while still ensuring that they are receiving a well-rounded education. While the curriculum may be flexible, it is important that the institution maintains the consistency of learning and ensures that students are receiving a high-quality education by providing support and resources to help students succeed and regularly evaluating and revising the curriculum to ensure that it is meeting the needs of students. The institute is making efforts to provide a well-rounded and holistic education that aligns with the goals of the National Education Policy 2020. The college offers a range of multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary programs. The institute has also adopted a Choice Based Credit System which allows students to have flexibility in their course choices and encourages the integration of humanities and science with SEC, MDC and VAC subjects. Overall, the institute is committed to developing the capacities of its students in an integrated manner as outlined in the National Education Policy 2020. To engage in multidisciplinary research culture and scientific innovations and to address perennial socio-economic issues, Add-on courses on Computer Application, Accounting and Publishing, Remote Helpdesk Technician, Software Program under National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC), Assistant Technician, Networking and Storage under National Institute of Electronics and Information technology (NEILIT) and some other Add on certificate courses offered by various department like Fundamentals of Fintech, Start-up Ecosystem, Tally, Fundamental of Journalism etc. have been started. At the academic level, collaboration has been established with various educational and research institutions at the state and national level, Don Bosco University, Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship (IIE), Guwahati, Amtron, Guwahati etc. In addition, collaboration has also been established with government offices like the Nalbari Municipal Board, NGOs, Nalbari Sports Association (NSA), Nalbari etc. to undertake different activities. In toto: 1. Nalbari Commerce College is committed to providing a flexible and multidisciplinary

curriculum that aligns with the National Education Policy 2020, allowing students to customize their education while ensuring high-quality learning outcomes. 2. The initiatives of the college, including collaborations with various institutions and the introduction of add-on courses, aim to enhance students' skills and prepare them for diverse career opportunities.

#### 2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Nalbari Commerce College, as an affiliated institution under Gauhati University, is actively implementing measures in response to NEP 2020, including the establishment of the ABC system to facilitate flexible learning pathways for students. The college is also fostering research and collaboration initiatives to enhance educational quality and support faculty development, thereby promoting a culture of innovation and societal benefit. Nalbari Commerce College is not an autonomous institution, it is an affiliated college under Gauhati University. The college adheres to the norms and guidelines prescribed by the affiliating university which also issues course completion certificates to the students. However, considering the implementation of NEP 2020, the college has been undertaking various measures. The college has formed a committee and appointed a Nodal Officer to take necessary measures for implementing the ABC system. The institution has registered under the ABC to permit its learners to avail the benefit of multiple entries and exits during the chosen program. However, the ABC system has not been started properly. This year the admission of students into UG 1st Semester Class has been done through Govt launched online admission portal 'SAMARTH' and after the creation of the database of students, the ABC system will be implemented. The institution has also taken the initiative to encourage students to enrol in different courses under SAWYAM. For seamless collaboration and internationalization of education, efforts have been made to collaborate with various academic and research institutions by the college at the national and state levels to strengthen research culture which will facilitate multiple entries and exist among the colleges in the long run. To encourage teachers of the college to design their own curricular and pedagogical approaches within the approved framework the college has taken various initiatives

through the IQAC and Research and Development Cell of the college. For example, the college sanctions research grants of Forty thousand rupees to one faculty member of the college every year to carry out research work in areas that are beneficial for society.

#### 3. Skill development:

Nalbari Commerce College prioritizes skill development by offering a variety of courses and programs that align with the revised curriculum of Gauhati University under NEP 2020. The college's initiatives, including vocational courses and add-on certifications, aim to empower students for selfemployment and foster a multidisciplinary research culture. Skill development is one of the most important areas and Nalbari Commerce College strives to excel. Gauhati University has also emphasised skill development in its revised curriculum under NEP 2020 and accordingly all the students irrespective of their discipline and subjects have to choose one skill development paper to appear in the examination. At the institutional level, the college has been offering a B.Voc. course in Information Technology (Software Development) under Gauhati University which is sponsored by Govt. of Assam. The college regularly organises various programs for the students by inviting professional instructors. In addition, to empower students to be self-employed, the college has been offering various add-on certificate courses approved by the National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NEILIT) and the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC). To engage in multidisciplinary research culture and scientific innovations and to address perennial socio-economic issues, Add-on courses on Computer Application, Accounting and Publishing, Remote Helpdesk Technician, Software Programr under National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC), Assistant Technician, Networking and Storage under National Institute of Electronics and Information technology (NEILIT) and some other Add on certificate courses offered by various department like Fundamentals of Fintech, Start-up Ecosystem, Tally, Fundamental of Journalism etc. have been started. The college also established one Creative Hub through which the college is offering hands-on training to students in making decorative items, dolls, bags etc. with clay,

plastics, bamboo, wood and various waste materials. Faculty members are encouraged to enrol in the Annual Refresher Program in Teaching (ARPIT) under SWAYAM. In addition, Moreover, the college also arranges an advanced proficiency Course in English for the desirous students.

4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):

India possesses a rich heritage of knowledge across various fields, making it essential to integrate this ancient wisdom into modern education for societal benefit. Nalbari Commerce College actively promotes this integration through celebrations of significant national events, language offerings, and cultural programs, thereby fostering a sense of patriotism and appreciation for local heritage among students. The Gauhati University has incorporated some aspects of the Indian knowledge system in its revised syllabus. However, in addition to the prescribed syllabus, Nalbari Commerce College, Nalbari on its part has undertaken some measures in this regard. The college has adopted a policy to celebrate the important events related to great and noble personalities of the country and thereby spread the ideas and thoughts propagated by those noble and great men which is a significant intervention in this direction. Moreover, the college observes various important National and Regional days/events to inculcate among students patriotic and nationalistic feelings. Degree courses are taught both in Assamese and English languages. The college offers Sanskrit as a subject for the students of B.A. in distance mode under Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University. Moreover, seminars in Folk and Performing Arts are also organized from time to time to highlight local art and culture among the students. The college conducts cultural programs regularly reflecting cultural heritage from time to time.

5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Nalbari Commerce College prioritizes student-centric learning by implementing various experiential and participative methods to enhance the educational experience. Key initiatives include orientation classes, hands-on training, and collaborative activities that foster engagement and practical application of knowledge. The college encourages student-centric learning methods in the teaching-learning process. For this purpose, at the beginning of the academic session, orientation classes on Program Outcome (PO), Course Outcome (CO), and Program Specific

Outcome (PSO) have been conducted under the supervision of the IQAC. Moreover, the emphasis has been given to experiential learning methods like field study, industry visits, visits to higher educational institutions, and invited lectures by eminent academicians. With regard to participative learning, the college gives importance to hands-on training, role play, peer class, book review, preparation of wall magazines, seminars, debates, quizzes, students' club activities, start-up competitions and poster-making competitions. Moreover, group discussion and project work are also referred to as problem-solving activities performed by the students.

#### 6. Distance education/online education:

The integration of ICT and online education has become essential in the teaching-learning process, enabling the college to maintain educational continuity during the COVID-19 pandemic through various digital platforms and resources. The college's commitment to accessible education is further demonstrated by its support for disadvantaged learners and the encouragement of dual degree opportunities through distance learning programs. With this objective in mind, the college provides a blended mode of teaching-learning system accessible to all students. During the countrywide lockdown due to Covid-19 COVID-19-induced pandemic, the college successfully continued online classes throughout the period under the guidance and supervision of IQAC and departmental heads. To facilitate round the clock teaching-learning process which facilitates easy access to learning materials in the form of soft copy or video classes uploaded by the teachers, WhatsApp groups were created separately for each class. Moreover, the college always encourages students to pursue various courses under SAWYAM. Besides, the faculty members regularly use Google Classroom, Zoom and other ICT-based platforms to continue the teachinglearning process. To facilitate the disadvantaged learners, the college started Study Centres of Assam State Open School, Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University and Gauhati University Centre of Distance and Online Education and through these Study Centres, the college has been offering various UG and PG Courses. Regular students are also encouraged to take admission in various distance learning courses simultaneously leading to dual

degrees.

The ELC of the college has been organizing various innovative programs in order to fulfil the objectives of the club. The club organized the following activities: 1. Observation of National Voter's Day 2. Observation of Constitution Day 3. Programs on 'My Vote, My Rights' 4. Awareness Lecture on 'Vote for Better India' The ELC of the college also support the District Administration in conducting various elections. The NCC cadets of 50 Assam Air Sqn NCC Unit of the college are engaged by the college through the ELC in order to maintain discipline in the voting booths. The ELC of the college also take various steps for crating awareness among students regarding their rights of ethical voting and their responsibilities for creating a better India. The ELC is following all the instruction of the District Administration as well as of all the government organization working for creating awareness about voting right among the students

The ELC of the college plans the following activities to be executed before the forthcoming Panchayat Election: 1. Awareness Campaign on importance of voting. 2. Publication of leaflets highlighting citizen's role in advancing democratic values.

5. Extent of students above 18 years who are yet to be enrolled as voters in the electoral roll and efforts by ELCs as well as efforts by the College to institutionalize mechanisms to register eligible students as voters.

The ELC along with the College Administration identifies the students above 18 years who are yet to be registered as voters and provide them with all necessary facilities of internet and computer to register themselves and also motivating the students by explaining them the pros of being a registered voter.

#### 1.1.1

The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

#### **Response:**

Nalbari Commerce College is affiliated to Gauhati University and the entire course curriculum for degree programme is designed by the University. The Certificate courses are designed by the institution itself. The curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned documentation is done accordingly.

The planned calendar is forwarded to the routine preparation committee .The committee accordingly prepares the college routine by giving equal importance to all the programmes with proper adjustment of infrastructural facilities. .

The College organizes orientation programme for the students. The Principal, Vice Principal, IQAC coordinator and Heads of the departments and teachers orients the students about the course, syllabus, code of conducts, different facilities in the college and rules and regulations.

There is also a provision for a bridge courses for the new comers to the college. It helped the learners to fulfil the gap between their earlier courses and newly entered courses.

Each Department monitors the learning of students through class tests, home assignments, group discussions and seminar presentations.

Each teacher maintains the regular records of the curriculum delivery in Academic Progress Report which is monitored by departmental Heads, Academic council and Principal.

College has adopted experiential learning methods and for that students are taken for field visits. Some of the departments offer project paper for students. Students do their field visit and project work under the guidance of teachers.

Marks are awarded for all activities assigned to the students and complete transparency is made in awarding the marks. Internal assessment marks are made public through display on notice board.

#### **Internal Assessment:**

For a Continuous Internal Evaluation, Examination committee of the college prepare a schedule for internal/sessional examination. The students are also informed in advance about the dates of sessional examination. Special Test are taken for Slow learners and absentees. Following the academic calendar, notifications for the Sessional Examination are issued by the college, set the question papers by the concerned departments of the college and examinations are conducted.

For making the internal assessment more transparent, notifications of obtained marks in internal assessments including assignments, seminars and group-discussions are kept in the departments for record.

To check the fairness of evaluation, answer scripts are distributed to students after evaluation.

Regarding assignment, the questions for the assignment are discussed in the class and the students are given stipulated time to submit it.

Records pertaining to internal assessments like attendance sheets, question papers, evaluated answer scripts, mark foils are kept by the Head of Departments which can be checked by the students and their parents.

Remedial classes are arranged if needed and finally, internal assessment marks are supplied to the university for declaration of end-semester results.

#### **Response:**

The college prioritizes student-centric approaches and utilizes ICT tools to enhance educational experiences, fostering practical learning, teamwork, and entrepreneurial skills among students. Through various initiatives, including community service, interdisciplinary learning, and the integration of technology, the institution prepares students for successful careers and active participation in governance and societal responsibilities. To achieve this, the college adopts a myriad of methods:

The Departments of B.Voc. IT are equipped with computer labs. Departments regularly undertake educational tours and field trips to acquaint students with the practical aspects of their curriculum.

Departmental Seminars, Group Discussions and Peer-Learning are regularly conducted. These activities allow students to develop teamwork and collaborative learning.

Students are encouraged towards entrepreneurship and for this purpose, the college organises events such as entrepreneurship training programmes, workshops on Research Methodology, IPR, start-up success, innovation and incubation, entrepreneurship and mindset development to involve students in such endeavours. Students are encouraged and assisted in pursuing research projects by the teachers in various departments.

To inculcate a sense of community service and civic responsibility, students are involved in Swachh Abhiyans, cleanliness drive, plantation drive organised by the students union, national service scheme, 50 Assam Air Sqn Assam, green audit cell, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Cell, Yuva Tourism club etc. Further cadets of 50 Assam Air Sqn involved in annual training camp, combined annual training camp, Ek Bharat Shrest Bharat (EBSB) camp, Pre Vayo Sena Camp and National Trekking camp. To equip students with tools that assist them in their careers after college, workshops on life skills, soft skills, and yoga are regularly organised. Every academic year, an annual College Week is organised where numerous extra-curricular activities and competitions take place.

Students are actively involved in the publication of the College Magazine-Nalbari Commerce College Magazine, competition for departmental Wall Magazines, and active participation in competitions conducted by the Innovations' Institution Council in the areas of life skills, entrepreneurial skills, marketing skills and innovation.

The Institution also arranges Classes, MCQ Tests, Online Tests, Quiz Competition, and essay competitions for the students as a part of problem-solving learning.

To align the curriculum delivered with the changes ushered in by the global digital revolution, and to equip students with an increasingly technology-dependent world, the college encourages the liberal use of ICT in the teaching-learning process. This comprises of Wi-Fi enabled campus for the students and teachers, and the use of virtual platforms like Google Meet, Zoom, Google Classroom, and Google Forms to provide study materials to the students.

The Central Library of the college facilitates students to access e-learning resources. During the lockdown induced by the Covid-19 pandemic, online classes using multiple platforms were successfully adopted by the college. The regular use of Emails, Cloud Storage, and instant messaging platforms have made communication easier between the faculty and the students. A certain number of faculty members have also been instrumental in developing e-learning content for the students and the majority of them

# 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

#### 2.5.1

Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time-bound and efficient

## **Response:**

Nalbari Commerce College is affiliated to Gauhati University and as such the college follows the guidelines of Gauhati University in conducting examinations and evaluation. Every year, the University issues an Academic Calendar for the General Degree Colleges and Institutes affiliated to the University. Internal Assessments are done by four measures.

- 1. Sessional Examination
- 2. Attendances
- 3. Group discussion and
- 4. Assignments/presentation
- 1. **Sessional Examination Notifications and Conduct**: Notifications for the sessional examinations are issued by the college as per the academic calendar. The concerned departments set the question papers for the examinations.
- 2. **Invigilation Duty**: The invigilation duty list is prepared by the sessional examination committee members.
- 3. **Internal Assessment Transparency**: Notifications of obtained marks in internal assessments, including assignments, seminars, and group discussions, are kept in the departments for the record.
- 4. **Fairness of Evaluation**: Answer scripts are distributed to students after evaluation to check the fairness of the evaluation process.
- 5. **Assignment Procedure**: The questions for assignments are discussed in class. Students are given a stipulated time to submit their assignments.
- 6. **Record Keeping**: Records related to internal assessments, such as attendance sheets, question papers, evaluated answer scripts, and mark foils, are kept by the Heads of Departments. These records are available for review by students and their parents.
- 7. **Academic Counselling**: Academic counselling is conducted based on the student's progression.
- 8. Mid-Semester Feedback and Review: Feedback from students on the mid-semester is assessed

- by the departments. Meetings for reviewing students' performance and organizing parent meetings are conducted at the departmental level.
- 9. **Remedial Classes**: Remedial classes are arranged if required, based on the assessment of students' performance.
- 10. **Internal Assessment Marks Submission**: Internal assessment marks are submitted to the University for the declaration of end-semester results.

The college has adopted the following mechanisms to deal with grievances pertaining to internal/external examinations.

# At the college level

The teachers of the respective courses distribute the evaluated answer scripts to the students to check their answer scripts. This ensures transparency of the internal assessment process. If there is any grievance from the student side, she/he can approach the teacher or Head of the department. Answer scripts of the student who lodged the grievance are reevaluated by another teacher of the department and intimated the marks to the student within 4- 6 days. The grievances if any are sorted out at the department level. Still, if there is any unresolved grievance, the same is referred to the Principal through the Head of the Department.

If any student fails to sit in the sessional exam with valid and authentic reasons and they have applied to the examination committee re-sessional examination is arranged for them with new question papers.

Students' performance review meetings along with parent meets are organized at the departmental level.

Academic counselling is provided by the departments based on students' progression. There is a structured individual feedback system in each department.

# At the University level:

If the students' grievances are related to end-semester results, the authority takes the initiative by forwarding the students' application to the University for further action.

# **Communication to students**

POs, PSOs and COs are well-displayed on the College website. To communicate the same to the stakeholders the following mechanism is adopted by the college authority:

Each department preserves the hard copy of the syllabi for reference Discussion takes place in the academic meeting regarding programme outcome and course outcome so that the plan for career counselling can be chalked out. The students are oriented about the learning outcome of the course in the orientation meetings as well as in the career counselling programmes held from time to time. In the orientation programme, students are communicated with the placements of the alumni of the various departments. Orientation Programmes are organized before the commencement of the course at college to make aware the students of the course outcomes and programmes offered to them. Every department plans its student-related activities based the particular outcomes. The departments introduce add-on courses, research and development cell organises workshops on research methodology, and conduct inhouse projects with M.com students. - 1. Nalbari Commerce College deploys many methods to assess the attainment of Programme Outcomes and Course Outcomes.
- 2. The college believes in the ideals of Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation so that the attainment of Course Outcomes remains inclusive and well-rounded.
- 3. The methods by which this attainment is measured are-
- 4. Interaction of students in the classroom with the faculty. The range of interaction and communication as expressed by a student allows teachers to measure whether they have benefited from the learning environment or not.
- 5. Performance of the student in Internal Assessment. and end-semester examinations. This is a method of direct evaluation and is most commonly used by all teachers for a quantitative and objective evaluation of the attainment.
- 6. After timely completion of the syllabus, course outcome (CO) is evaluated through organizing course-based seminars and workshops, project works and assignments; conducting field surveys and class tests etc.

# **Response:**

Good infrastructure with a barrier-free and eco-friendly environment enhances the quality of teaching-learning process. The college, keeping in mind the well-being of the stakeholders, has provided a well-built atmosphere by increasing the build-up area every year with good ventilated, ICT enabled classrooms and others. The college has a campus area of 6889 sq.m. and built-up area of 2888 sq.m. The college has infrastructural facilities like adequate classrooms, computer laboratories, computing equipments, staff rooms, conference/seminar hall, library with adequate reading space, computer, canteen, indoor sports complex, in-campus women hostel etc.

**Classroom:** There are 19 numbers of classrooms in the college, out of which 05 classrooms are provided with ICT facilities. In addition, there are 8 LCD projectors in various departments that are used for ICT-enabled learning as per the need. The classrooms are of different dimensions adequate to accommodate sanctioned strengths of different courses.

Computer Laboratories: The college has 01 state-of-the-art Computer Laboratory. There are 60 computers and all are LAN connected with internet facility of 50 mbps. The Computer Laboratory is used for computer classes of B.Com. and B.Voc. IT programs. Besides, the laboratory is also used for holding various add-on computer courses approved by National Institute of Electronics and Information technology (NEILIT) and National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC).

**Computer Equipments:** There are total 95 computers, out of which 68 are for use by students. At present there are 12 printers, 4 scanner cum printer and 3 Xerox machines in the college. One ICT-enabled seminar hall and one conference room are used for guest lectures/seminars/meetings/conferences.

There is one Video conference room to provide exposure to the students with the class/lecture given by eminent personalities from national/international institutions.

**Wi-Fi:** The college campus is Wi-Fi enabled.

**CCTV Camera:** 35 CCTV cameras have been functioning to keep vigil of the entire campus including the women hostel in order to ensure safety and security.

**Power Back-up:** For uninterrupted power supply, there are 3 generators of 5 KVA, 10 KVA and 100 KVA. respectively. Besides, 2 numbers of 10 KVA online UPS have been installed in the office and computer laboratory respectively.

**Solar Light:** In the campus of the college, 5 numbers of Solar lights (15 Watt LET based luminaries/fixtune M/ 1500 Lumens (Solar BSZSL) with PIR Sensor, IP65rating) have been installed to save expenditure in electricity and to ensure light in the entire campus.

Biometric Attendance System: Biometric system for staff attendance is used in the college.

**Central Library:** The well-furnished Central Library of the college is equipped with 15261 textbooks/reference books, a good number of e-books and e-journals under NLIST Program, 6 journals, 9 periodicals/magazines, 3 Newspapers (2 Regional and 1 National), and 1 database, There is one Competitive Examination Corner where books and journals for competitive examinations are kept.

**Health Centre:** There is a Health Centre in the college which is used for proving primary health care for sick students and staff on emergency ground. The Health Centre also organizes some Health Awareness Programs, Free Health Check-up programs etc.

### **Response:**

The Central Library of Nalbari Commerce College, Nalbari has good collection which includes textbooks, reference books, Journals, Magazines and newspapers. The library is automated with digital facilities using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS), adequate subscriptions to e-resources and journals are made. The library is optimally used by the faculty and students. Nalbari Commerce College, Nalbari also has 12 departmental libraries along with the Central library. The Central Library is fully automated with SOUL 3.0 ILMS and Barcode technology. It has 15261 printed books and subscription of 6 printed journals, 3 newspapers and 9 magazines. The library has reference books, Minor and Major Research Project Reports, College Magazines etc. Library has a reading room with around 40 seating capacity. There is a separate reading room for Students and Teachers. Library is open from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM in all working days. A student can borrow 2 books for 15 days, faculty members can borrow 20 books for 90 days. There is a library Advisory Committee for library management including Principal, IQAC Co-Ordinator, Librarian and few Faculty members. The library purchases new books as per the requisition given by the faculty members and students. Faculties are provided with a standard book requisition form which they fill up with the required books and the Librarian forwards requisition to the Principal and after market survey, the Principal places order of the Books from vendor. Library also has a purchase suggestion box where library users can suggest books to be purchased. Library orientation programme is carried out for new students in where details about the library collection, services, timing and doubts of students if any. Various activities like Lecture Sessions, Group Discussions, Quiz competition, Debate Competition among students are organized regularly. The Librarian's day is also celebrated every year on the birth anniversary of Dr. SR Ranganathan.

**Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) in the Library:** Library is automated with digital facilities using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS), adequate subscriptions to e-resources and journals are made. The library is optimally used by the faculty and students. The central library of the college is running with the help of SOUL3.0 software through which circulation work of the library

has been started by using bar code in the students' Library card.

**Register Attendance:** Register based attendance system for both students and staffs.

**Book Browsing:** The holdings of the library can be searched using OPAC facilities

**Digital Library:** It has a separate digital library section with 8 computers and all are connected with internet.

**Membership of E-Contents:** The Library is a member of the INFLIBNET N-LIST facilities. The users can access E-books and E-journals available in the N-LIST database and E-books through NDLI.

Every Department has been provided desktops computers along with scanner printer to carry out their academic needs. College has one computer lab for the students as well as faculties. Initially the internet service had been provided in the campus by NIC. Later on the college also adopted internet connection from Jio and BSNL. But due to the connectivity problem the college has adopted Airtel Fibre internet connection (100 MBPS) for providing the internet and Wi-Fi services in the college campus.

Anti-virus is regularly updated. The college has been taking initiatives to run teaching learning process through blended mode of learning. During Covid-19 pandemic period online classes were done through Google Classroom, Google Meet etc. To meet the requirements of digital mode of learning 1 classroom

is being used as digital classroom and Smart Class Room. However, there are facilities of digital

The College administrative office has adequate IT infrastructure. The office works are conducted using software called 'Aamar College' designed and developed by S.S. Technology, Guwahati. The college is planning to maintain the finance and accounts of the College through online using 'Aamar College' software. All admission and examination related works are done through the software. Online Feedback System is also available. College Website is designed and developed by Adroit Digisoft, Guwahati and also updated regularly. A Library Management Software (SOUL 3.0) is installed at the Library to keep track of the library documents. Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) service has been provided to the students where they can search the status and location of documents. The whole campus is under CCTV surveillance.

# 6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

#### 6.4.1

Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)

### **Response:**

The institution has a transparent and well planned financial management system in which the State Government, the UGC, the ICSSR and the RUSA are the main funding agencies. Funds are also generated from the reimbursed students' admission fees by the State Government. Fund is also mobilized by the college from some other sources like:

- Students' Admission, examination and other Fee
- Occasional govt grants (RUSA, ICSSR, NEILIT under Central Govt.)
- Centre fees collected by the college by allowing its venue to be used for conducting various Govt. examinations.
- Centre fees collected from Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University.
- Centre fees collected from Assam State Open School.
- Nominal venue fees collected from outside parties for using the Seminar Hall.
- Fund generated by selling organic manure and scraps generated in the college.
- Interests accrued from the savings deposit accounts of the college.
- Funds received for NSS units from government sources.
- Application fees received from candidates applying for recruitment in different posts etc.

For the optimal utilization of all funds, the Governing Body forms various committees like Construction Committee, Purchase Committee, Annual Budget Preparation Committee, RUSA Project Monitoring Unit etc. These committees monitor the proper utilization of funds and submit reports to the Principal. The college also ensures the proper mobilization and optimal utilization of physical and academic resources available in the college. As the college has limited land mass, so utmost care is taken in using

the open spaces. Every new construction was done with proper planning.

The internal audit is conducted yearly by the Institutions audit committee which consists of various stake holders as well as the faculties with expertise in accounting practices. The books of accounts, vouchers for transactions, grant orders and completion reports are all collected and verified. The collected materials are scrutinised to check whether the regulations and accounting principles were followed while maintaining the books of accounts. The balances of cash books are verified with the bank statements and the physical cash in hand available at the end of the year. After the proper verification and scrutiny of the materials, a report is thereby prepared highlighting any discrepancies if found and with suggestions on its rectification. The external audit is conducted by the Department of Audit (Local Fund), Govt. of Assam. The periodicity of such an audit is however at the discretion of the aforementioned department.

Nalbari Commerce College is committed to create a gender equal environment. The college adopts a host of measures to ensure gender equity at both academic and administrative levels. The admission procedure takes into account merit and reservation policies enunciated by the Government in which both genders are given adequate representation. Admission fees are waived for students belonging to BPL category as per Govt. of Assam Rules.

As part of the curriculum, certain departments offer papers containing issues of gender equity and gender sensitization. There is adequate representation of women faculties along with the male counterparts in all the Cells and Committees. The annual students' union election also witness participation and representation of both boys and girls in voting and the Union body.

Apart from it, gender sensitization and awareness programs on mental, physical and menstrual health, capacity building, and skill development programs are conducted in each academic session. International Women's Day is celebrated each year. Anti ragging awareness, grievance redressal, career counseling programs are held from time to time to tap into the issues and problems of the students with special emphasis on the girl students and also provide them opportunity to learn about various employment opportunities and higher education programs.

With regard to infrastructural facilities, separate rest rooms and wash rooms have been built, a triple storied girls hostel for accommodation of outstation girls, has also been constructed for the safety and well being of the students, two sanitary napkin vending machines have also been installed to take care of the menstrual needs of the female students in the Girls' Common Room and Women Hostel.

In order to inculcate the values of communal harmony, peace, patriotism and also promote awareness regarding various social issues and let the students know about their historical roots and legacies the Institution observes events, festivals and commemorative programs of national, regional and global significance with various in house and extension activities. These initiatives help in increasing social consciousness, inculcate humanitarian and democratic ethos and also promote a spirit of unity and diversity in the institution. The holistic and consistent approach of Nalbari Commerce College to fostering research and innovation makes the institution different. Its commitment to nurturing a research culture, mentoring budding entrepreneurs, and providing practical, real-world learning opportunities sets it apart from other provincialized colleges in Assam. Its blend of academic rigour and hands-on experience creates a dynamic learning environment that empowers students to thrive in the competitive world of entrepreneurship and innovation. This forward-thinking approach helps shape students not just as academics but as innovators and leaders who are ready to address real-world challenges.

Nalbari Commerce College has a distinctive feature regarding the fostering of research culture within the college. It is a provincialized college distinct from other colleges of the state of Assam in research culture. Despite the college's facing financial crisis it has been striving to promote an environment conducive to research and innovative learning approach. This is evident through many more instances that the institution is undertaking. One of the instances that the college is taking initiative is that the college is offering a research grant of Rs. 40000 to the faculty member working in the college itself. The research grant is offered after the name of the late Dr Nripendra Malla Buzar Baruah who happened to be the founder president of the college. Such an initiative not only promotes research culture but also inspires the faculty members to undertake research work in different fields. In the academic session 2023-24 Dr. Uddipana Gogoi was awarded the grant and successfully completed her project and submitted the report. Likewise, Dr. Rajat has been awarded the research grant for the academic session 2024-25 and is now pursuing his project. This is one of the major thrusts the college is performing that other colleges of the state of Assam are probably not.

Secondly, the college is dedicated to encouraging to enhancement of research skills among the students. It has been constantly offering 2 awards for the students who show excellence in research. The student carrying out research works at the postgraduate level and getting the highest marks in the dissertation is offered the best dissertation award. In the UG level too, the student getting the highest mark in the project report is offered the best project report award. It deserves mentioned here that the awards are sponsored by the teachers working at the institution. The attempt brings competitiveness into the minds of the students and the students try to show excellence. Such an initiative is not probably undertaken by the provincialized college in Assam.

To promote the research culture among the students of the college, in addition to the research required under the syllabus, the postgraduate students carry out in-house research projects funded by the college. The students are grouped and assigned a relevant topic supervised by one or two teacher-supervisors. They accomplish their works collectively and the Research and Development Cell of the college patronises in writing the reports. While conducting their work they are provided financial, intellectual, and logistic support by the college.

Before conducting the in-house research projects, a 7-day workshop on research methodology in social science is conducted by the R&D Cell of the college. The workshop equips the students with the basics of research to carry out research. The students are allowed to participate in the workshop free of cost. A group of 10 students are made to conduct one research project. Teachers from the college and other higher education institutions are invited to participate in the workshop as resource persons. The college teachers serve the workshop without any remuneration.

Based on these initiatives, Nalbari Commerce College stands out due to its comprehensive approach to fostering innovation and entrepreneurship. The college not only organizes a wide array of events—such as impact lecture series, mentoring sessions, and workshops on topics like fintech, IPR, and sustainable development—but also provides opportunities for students to engage directly with local entrepreneurs and professionals. This combination of academic guidance, practical exposure, and focus on community-driven entrepreneurship helps nurture both the skills and mindset required for future innovators, making it distinct from other institutions.

The college has been organising several calendar activities concerning business idea development, which were scheduled around the year. Workshops like "How to Develop New Business Ideas" (November 23, 2023), "Workshop on Design Thinking, Critical Thinking and Innovation Design" (February 27, 2024),

and "Angel Investment or Venture Capital Funding Opportunity" (August 27, 2024) were very extensively conducted as scheduled quarter activities.

Celebratory events like a Speech competition on National Entrepreneurship Day, and a session on "India's Initiative Towards Energy Conservation" (December 14, 2023) reveal the institution's commitment towards innovation. Novelties are also reflected in self-driven activities in creative competitions directly related to innovations and entrepreneurship. "Fundamentals of Fintech & Innovation" (September 28, 2023), "Spell Bee Competition" (March 12, 2024), and "IT Quiz on Innovation and IPR" (August 14, 2024) were able to demonstrate the innovative talents and critical thinking of the students.

The Mentoring Sessions on National Education Day (November 11, 2023) and others such as the "Startup Day Celebration" (January 16, 2024) and "Inter-Institutional Competition for Innovation and Entrepreneurship" (August 30, 2024) demonstrate the college's continuous efforts to mentor budding entrepreneurs and facilitate their transition from conceptualization to real-world application.
